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2022 CoC Program Application – Rating and Ranking Procedure

The deadline to submit project applications is **September 30, 2022** through the HUD e-snaps portal.

For the FY 2022 CoC Program Competition, Renewal Application scoring is based on the CoC’s System Performance Measurements based on data from October 1, 2020 to September 30, 2021. As all projects in the CoC contribute data to the System Performance Measurements via their HMIS data entry for their individual projects, using the same date range aligns the evaluation of a project’s performance to the data submitted to HUD that HUD will be using to score the overall CoC Application.

The Treasure Coast Homeless Services Council will use the following tool to review and rank projects.

This tool satisfies the objective criteria requirement in the FY 2022 CoC Program NOFO. The resulting Priority Listing will be the official project ranking record for the CoC Program NOFO.
